phonological awareness
decoding
encoding
sight word study
comprehension
fluency

PHONOLOGICAL AWARENESS

Phonological awareness is a broad skill that includes identifying and manipulating syllables, sounds, onsets and rimes. Phonological Awareness is a building block of reading.

SIGHT WORDS

Sight words are high-frequency words that students should recognize on sight.

DECODING

Decoding is the ability to apply knowledge of letter-sound relationships, including knowledge of letter patterns, to correctly read written words.

ENCODING

Encoding is the ability to apply knowledge of letter-sound relationships, including knowledge of letter patterns, to correctly spell words.

FLUENCY

Fluency is defined as the ability to read with speed, accuracy, and proper expression.
